


# UTS AVOIDING PLAGIARISM

## How do I create an Avoiding Plagiarism Quiz link in UTSONline?


Instructors and Subject Coordinators can create a link in their UTSONline subject site to an Avoiding Plagiarism quiz. By creating this link in UTSONline, you can take advantage of a student's Avoiding Plagiarism quiz results being automatically pushed to the UTSONline subject site Grade Centre.

**Step 1 of 6:** Log into UTSONline and access your UTSONline subject site from the **My Subjects** module.







**Step 3 of 6:** Select and open a **Content Area** in your UTSONline subject site, open the **Tools** menu, and select the Avoiding Plagiarism tool for your **Discipline**. This will open the **Create** page. If your Discipline is not listed in the Tools menu, select *Avoiding Plagiarism: GENERIC*.



**Step 4 of 6:** In the **Create** page, enter a name for the link e.g. "Avoiding Plagiarism Quiz". This is the name that will appear to students.




